Annual Membership

Guild of Players Membership runs annually from 1st September – 31st August each year. We ask that members complete a membership form each year in September so that we have your up-to-date contact details and which theatre activities you are interested in.

New members can join at any point in the year (and will be charged pro rata). Notification of approval of your membership will be issued as soon as possible, following the meeting of the Board of Directors of the Guild of Players, where applications are approved. Membership will cease by 30th Sept the following year, if membership has not been renewed.

Conditions (18 years old +):

- Sign up to the Guild of Players Members Code of Conduct.
- Support the aims and activities of our charity, which include advancement of (a) the arts, heritage and culture and (b) community development of all ages, and particularly young people, as detailed in our Articles of Association, and subscribe to these.
- Complete a membership form annually and lodge with the charity (renewal each September at the start of the Guild of Players theatrical season).

Objectives

The Guild of Players charity's objects are:
 (a) The advancement of the arts, heritage and culture, in particular but not exclusively, through the promotion and support of performance, exhibition, instruction and study of all forms of art and culture and the preservation, maintenance, improvement and operation of theatres, venues and other similar facilities.

(b) The advancement of community development by providing, improving and maintaining public amenities, supporting local regeneration, providing education and training opportunities, providing and improving arts and recreational facilities, encouraging volunteering and increasing the involvement of people of all ages and abilities and, in particular, young people, in community activity centred on the arts and so assisting with the regeneration of their communities.

(c) To pursue such objects as may by law be deemed charitable and, in particular, to promote the well-being of the community resident in Dumfries and in the wider area of Dumfries and Galloway by associating Local Authorities, local artistic organisations and residents in a common effort to advance education and to foster a community spirit for the achievement of the aforesaid purposes.

Structure and Aims

Guild of Players was originally formed as an amateur dramatic company in 1913. It bought the Theatre Royal Dumfries in 1959, became a Scottish Charity in 1961 and a Company Ltd by guarantee in 2012. The Guild of Players has been in the heart of Dumfries for over 100 years, and the Theatre Royal Dumfries venue has had performers treading the boards and bringing entertainment and laughter to the town since 1792 – that's over 230 years! The Guild of Players has 1 full time and 7 part-time employees, who alongside our Members, make the team which provide and manage the activities at the Theatre Royal Dumfries. As a producing and receiving theatre, the Guild of Players welcomes a wide range of incoming performances to Dumfries as part of our year-round live programme of events.

Season

Guild of Players Members put on a season of theatrical productions each year, including the annual pantomime and our members help in all sorts of ways – you don't have to be an actor and go on stage! There are lots of opportunities to get involved. Guild of Players Members provide invaluable support to grow our theatre charity to advance the arts, culture and heritage, as well as look after the theatre we own - Theatre Royal Dumfries, Scotland's oldest working theatre.

Structure

The Board of Directors of the Guild of Players and its sub-committees, including the Guild of Players Council oversee the strategic and operational management of the theatre. Full members have the opportunities to get involved and influence the future of the Guild of Players. We also welcome Guild of Players members who wish to help in a variety of roles.
